Supply list:

Ink – any kind (Higgins Eternal and Walnut are excellent)

Pen – we will make a writing tool that works well for the simple script we'll be using.

If you have a 6 mm Parallel Pen (blue cap), please, bring it.

X-Acto knife or craft knife, cutting mat or mat board scrap (at least 9x12), bone folder, pencil and eraser, 12" metal ruler (or longer), scissors, glue stick, a few paperclips, double stick tape, embossing stylus (if you have one), scrap paper, a few sheets of interesting text weight paper (8 ½" x 11). This could be scrapbook paper, gift wrap (not too thin), plain color or patterned. 5-10 ordinary white envelopes – whatever size(s) you like to use.
