

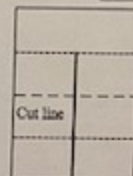
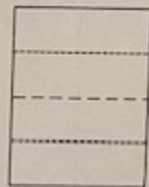
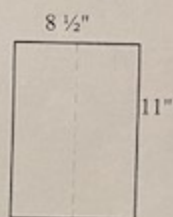

Oxbow or Pants Accordion Booklet

1. You will need a folding tool, scissors, ruler, $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" sheet of text paper (any size larger than 7" x 10"), ribbon (optional) and pencil.
2. Turn Place paper vertically in front of you. Fold the long sides together. Crease. Open.
3. Fold short side together. Crease. Open.
4. Turn the sheet over so that the width-wise fold becomes a mountain.
5. Fold in the ends to the width fold. Crease. Open.
6. Cut down the lengthwise fold, leaving one rectangle from the edge. Accordion fold, alternating mountains and valleys. When you fold up the book, you may put the horizontal fold over the top like a tent.





Colored Pencil Tips For Fabric

- ◊ Crayola & Prismacolor brand colored pencils contain pigment, clay and wax.
- ◊ When your pencil lead keeps breaking, microwave it for 20 seconds. Let it cool.

- ◊ Use #2 graphite under color to darken. Use compliment color to cool.
- ◊ Green & yellow are aggressive colors and are hard to change.
- ◊ Use warm tones on black fabric. Black background cools any color used.

- ◊ Highlight by bearing down.
- ◊ Cut a stencil. Spot glue-stick to fabric. Stroke lightly from stencil edge onto fabric. Repeat again with same or new color until you are happy with the results. Remove stencil.

- ◊ Add more color if desired. Press again. Remove freezer paper when done.
- ◊ To remove colored pencil from fabric press cellophane tape onto spot. Rub with blunt end of pencil.

◊ Leave air between glass & frame of colored pencil art to prevent damage. Never use pencil-glass.

- ◊ Set color by placing fabric inside folded parchment paper. Press with hot iron and lift.
- ◊ To keep iron clean place white napkin on surface, press. Wipe iron edges onto the napkin to remove all crayon residue.
