CARD WITH ATTACHED PANEL FOR PUNCH OUTS AND RIBBON

Half sheet of cardstock, folded to 5 1/2" x 4 1/4" Contrasting panel of cardstock cut to 3 3/4" x 2 3/4" 5" piece of ribbon envelope

Punch a line of three motifs at the top and bottom of contrasting panel of cardstock. Punch two holes in the center of the panel about 1 1/2" apart. Thread the ends of ribbon through the front so both ends are in the back. Cross over and thread back through the front. Trim the ends of the ribbon and attach the panel to the card. You can either attach it with double stick tape or glue it flat, or you could use foam tape so you have a raised panel.

Keep your punched out motifs to decorate the inside of the card or the envelope.

THANK YOU/HAPPY BIRTHDAY CARD

Decide on the size of the card you want to make, and cut and score a piece of cardstock. Stamp and emboss your sentiment with gold ink on a torn-edged panel of vellum. Attach the vellum to a darker cardstock panel with brads, then tuck another piece of contrasting cardstock between the first panel and the vellum. Attach/glue the first panel to the card. You may also need to put a bit of glue on the second piece of cardstock to stop it slipping out.

Pressed Flower Card With Vellum Envelope

Blank card
Self adhesive label
Tissue paper (white)
Pressed flower or weed
Card stock to tone with, and back, the flower
Vellum for envelope

- I- Peel label off backing, sticky side up. Place flower on the sticky surface.
- 2. Cut a piece of tissue paper large enough to cover the label. Scrunch up and smooth out. Then place on top of flower and label. Press down firmly.
- 3. Trim edges of label and tissue. Stick on to toning card stock.
- 4. Trim and adhere to card.
