


## A Simple Celtic Knot




1. Using graph paper (or not) draw a line of four dots and repeat 3 times so you get a dot square made of nine squares.




2. Draw a bigger dot in the middle of each of the nine dot squares. If bigger, it is easier to see, as center dots.

3. Join each of the 4 smaller dots from the center square to the bigger dots diagonal to it. Try to draw each line with a hook as it goes around the bigger dots in the corners.





4. From each big center dot between the hooks of your first 4 lines, draw a continuous line that joins 3 more dots in a row, as it goes around the corners of the main square of your design.



5. From one of the big dots in the corner (end of hook), draw a line that joins 2 more dots on the outside of the image. Then you continue this 3 more times to get a 'sort of' square circle that goes under the 4 diagonal shapes drawn earlier.

6. From the big center dot, draw 4 complete squares alternating sides in the center of your celtic knot. Voila! – a simple celtic knot. Note: Make lines parallel alternating inside and outside of dots. See illustration.



7. Shade in the design where each side of the 'road' goes under the 'bridge' to give a 3D effect. Darken the edges of your lines with your pencil or a black pen. Color and border can be added using colored pencils or water color.
